Dear Prime Minister,

Re: Protection of Liberty

I, Jack McKelvie Wilson, do solemnly swear that I own a Model 311A Stevens double barrel shotgun which I purchased when I was eighteen years old. I use this firearm for target shooting and hunting.

I further swear that: (a) I do *NOT* have a firearms license, (b) this firearm is *NOT* registered, (c) I did *NOT* send a "Letter of Intent to Register" this firearm before 31December2002, and (d) I have *NO* intention of ever registering this firearm.

I fully understand that my ownership and possession of this firearm violates the Firearms Act of 1995 and Section 91(1)(a) & (b) of the Criminal Code of Canada.

I send this Letter of Non-Compliance directly to you, Prime Minister, as a open, honest, peaceful act of civil disobedience. I do not undertake this action lightly. I respect the "Rule of Law", and I respect the institutions of Canada, but I can not submit to an unjust law. I take this action to preserve my most sacred Freedoms and Civil Liberties.

The Firearms Act of 1995, and the subsequent changes to the Criminal Code of Canada, violates at least seven specific Liberties guaranteed by the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. Furthermore the Firearms Act violates the Canadian Constitution, the Canadian Bill of Rights, English Common Law, the English Bill of Rights of 1688, and the Magna Carta.

I refuse to surrender my right to privacy, the right to mobility, the right to be secure from unreasonable search and seizure, the right against self incrimination, the right to the presumption of innocence, the right to representation, and, the right to freedom of association. I steadfastly maintain my right to security of person.

I will not silently submit to an unjust law that does nothing to improve the safety of Canadians. I will not tolerate the insidious destruction of my civil Rights and Liberty.
